Passage A (Source: Scott Miles (2008), Essential Reading)

Immigration is one way to **replenish** a workforce, but this is not always an easy solution. Immigration has helped the United States maintain a healthy economy despite a low birth rate among the majority race, white Americans. The trade-off is a radical change in the racial and cultural makeup of the society. As non-Hispanic, white Americans continue to have fewer and fewer children, immigrant minority numbers are rising rapidly. By 2050, white Americans will still be the largest racial group. They will make up less than half of the total American population. The fastest growing minority is Hispanic, which currently makes up slightly over 14 percent of the population, surpassing the African-American population in 2000. Already, Hispanics are the majority race in Los Angeles, and will be the dominant racial/ethnic group in California and Texas in the next few decades. Some feel that as the United States has always been a nation of immigrants, this kind of change is of no great cause for concern. Whether or not the traditionally highly homogenous countries of Asia would be able to tolerate such fundamental changes in their societies **may be another matter**, however. Currently, immigration laws in Asian nations are quite restrictive.

In the meantime, European and Asian governments promote ambitious programmes to encourage couples to have more children, but declining populations have proven very difficult to reverse. Thus far, no country that has fallen below a birth rate of 1.5 has managed to rise back to the population replacement

Passage B (Source: John Langan (2005) Ten Steps to Improving Colleges Reading Skills)

We tend to think that children in the same family will grow up to be more similar than unrelated people. This is a fundamental part of our lore: brothers who are alike in their enjoyment of sports or sisters who both take up the law. However, comprehensive studies in Sweden, Great Britain, the United States, Finland, and other countries show that a shared family environment does not affect children's personalities at all! This is because, even within a family, each child grows up in a thoroughly different world from the others.

Although siblings share many genes, other factors, including birth order, make children live in distinct worlds and develop quite differently even in the same home. The research leads to a radical conclusion: families do not make us similar to our siblings; they make us different. Genetics accounts for similarities among children in the same families, but it is family experiences that make them different. Most parents, for instance, treat girls differently from boys and firstborns differently from those born later.

For example, two sisters were at a dinner party when the conversation turned to upbringing. The elder sister started to say that her parents had been very strict and that she had been rather frightened of them. Her sister, younger by two years, interrupted in amazement. "What are you talking about?" she said. "Our parents were very **lenient**. I remember being allowed to stay out late and to do all sorts of things. How could you call them strict?"

Both were accurate: one sister had received different treatment from the other. The first child had borne the brunt of parental anxiety all through her childhood and was stopped from doing things that might possibly be dangerous or unsuitable. But by the time the younger one was growing up, the parents had learned to relax a bit, since the first daughter hadn't gotten into trouble, and they were much more likely to let the second daughter do what she wanted.

Although certain personality traits do run in families, siblings are far more disparate than they are alike. When they are tested, their scores are as different as those of unrelated people brought up separately.
